

Fairweather Invitational

Featuring the Fairweather Cup

At Great Southern Archers

The **Fairweather Invitational** is a WA Registered 24 Field round event being held in recognition of our founding members **Rob and Helen Fairweather**. This is a handicapped mixed team and non-gender specific competition with one archer from each bow style making a team of three. -

WA Field Team Competition

- **Compound**
- **Olympic Recurve**
- **Barebow Recurve or Longbow**

As a finale, the top three off the bow score for each team in the WA Registered Field Team Competition, will be selected, along with the highest handicapped team (not previously selected in the three) as a Wildcard, and will compete in four teams of three, for a four target, one arrow per archer per target shoot off. Then a grand final head to head for the top two teams. This secondary competition will be the **Fairweather Cup**.

There will be awards based on team's handicap score for the Fairweather Invitational, along with individual off the bow WA Arrowhead and Record Claims, and for the Fairweather Cup, their team off the bow score.

You are invited to get a team together and take part in this dynamic event, which will be held on Sunday 13 August 2023 at the GSA field course, 85 Forrest Road, Strathalbyn. Teams do not have to all come from the one club and if you are unable to form a team but want to participate then contact Shane Bergl at tournaments@greatsouthernarchers.com.au by 7 August and he will create as many teams as possible from those who apply.

The entry fee is \$20 per archer payable on the day. Entrants must register for the WA Registered 24 field event in Archer's Diary by 11 August and email your team's name and members along with their bow styles to tournaments@greatsouthernarchers.com.au.

BBQ and drinks supplied on the day for \$10. Medals for winners and placeholders in both events, along with individual WA Arrowhead and Record's Claims, and a chance to compete as a team in an incredibly unique event!
