

GSA Super Field 25th February 2024

Competition Rules



Format: The format of this competition is a 48 target field round, comprised of (i) a 24 target marked field round shot in the morning, and (ii) a 24 target unmarked field round shot in the afternoon. Both rounds are registered as QRE's and will be shot as individual rounds according to World Archery (WA) rules and requirements. The archers score for the marked round will be added to the score for the unmarked round to determine their overall score and hence position within the GSA Super Field event.

When and where: 25th February 2024, 85 Forest Road Strathalbyn, SA

Objectives:

- Provide QRE rating opportunities prior to Archery Australia Field National event (8-11th March 2024)
- Foster new and club-level archers to compete by incorporating prizes (cash/vouchers) for the handicapped component of the event.

Competition categories: There will be two competition categories.

1. WA standardised divisions, based on (i) gender, (ii) bow type and (iii) age.
2. Handicapped event:
 - all bow types and age groups are pooled, with separate categories for male and female
 - The archers individual handicap is used to account for differences in bow type (long bow, bare bow recurve, recurve, compound) and age within the respective group.

Awards for WA standardised divisions: The winning score will be the highest marked + unmarked "off-the-bow" score. Where there are 4 or more archers competing in the respective *gender, bow type and age* division, awards will be made to the top 3 archers (gold, silver, bronze). If there are less than 4 competing archers, the number of awarded places will be reduced i.e., if there are 3 archers, the top 2 archers will be awarded. If there are 2 archers, only the winner will be awarded. If there is only 1 competing archer, no award will be made. Awards for the WA standardised divisions will be in the form of medallions.

Awards for "Super Field" event: The winning score will be the highest marked + unmarked handicapped score with places awarded for male and female. Top 5 places will be awarded. In the case of a draw for any award, the outcome will be decided by a single arrow shoot-off at the maximum distance for the respective bow type/age of the respective archer.

Awards for the handicap event will be comprised of vouchers and/or cash. Total value of payout subject to entry numbers.

Registration: Registration is via Archers Diary. Archers must be a current financial member of Archery Australia. Members of ABA or other recognised archery organisations are welcome, but will need to become a temporary member of Archery Australia for insurance purposes.

Entries close 5pm Monday 19th February. Late entrants will be at the discretion of the GSA committee and may incur an additional fee. Fee for the event is \$30. This includes standard shoot fees and the prize pool.

A BBQ lunch and drinks will be available for \$10.
